Required Equipment:

- Scissors or utility knife
- Dust Mask
- Safety Glasses
- Gloves
- Long Sleeves (optional)
- Spray Trim Adhesive

Carpet/Mat Installation Guide:

- Use the image to the right to match pieces of Stealth Shield to your carpet or floor mat.
- 2. Gluing the pieces down is optional. Use a spray trim adhesive found at any auto parts store to secure in place. It will function the same with or without glue.




Dog House Installation Steps:

- 1. Put on all personal protection equipment, gloves, mask, and safety glasses.
- 2. Carefully remove the stock heat shield. Start at the bottom of the heat shield. It helps to use painters tape (see image 2) to hold back the weather stripping. Leave the tape in place to also aid in reinstallation of the stock heat shield.
- 3. It would be a good idea to mask off the edges and interior side of your engine cover to avoid overspray from the adhesive from getting on the interior side of your cover.
- 4. Lay out the pieces from your kit (see Image 3 and 4. Be sure each piece is in the correct orientation.
- 5. CLEAN the engine cover. Scrub all dirt and grease. Make sure it is free of all grease, dirt, and dust. Using isopropyl alcohol or other none residue cleaner with one final pass before proceeding to the next step.









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Installation Steps

- 6. Lightly spray the top piece with spray adhesive, allow it to get slightly tack. Then install (see Image 5)
- 7. Install the smaller passenger side piece using spray adhesive (see Image 6).
- 8. Install the large middle section piece using spray adhesive (see Image 7). Make sure to push the material into the contours of the middle section.
- 9. Install the bottom piece using spray adhesive (see Image 8).
- 10. IMPORTANT: Reinstall the factory heat shield starting at the top of the dog house and push it back into place. You may have to push it back under the weather stripping. (Image 9)
